



# Lindenwood calls Dr. Ron Buck

It was a historic day May 24 when Lindenwood Christian Church overwhelmingly approved Rev. Dr. Ron Buck as the church's new Senior Minister. He will be the 18<sup>th</sup> Senior Minister to serve Lindenwood since its founding in 1843.



Ron and Cathie Buck received a standing ovation when the results of the vote were announced.

A total of 320 members voted during a special congregational meeting held in the Sanctuary at 1 p.m. Sunday, May 24. Of those voting, 318 members (99.4 percent) voted to call Dr. Buck as Senior Minister. When the results of the vote were announced, the congregation responded with a standing ovation and thunderous applause as Dr. Buck and his wife Cathie entered the Sanctuary.

Dr. Buck comes to Lindenwood from First Christian Church in Hopkinsville, Ky., where he is Senior Minister. He has also served Disciples of Christ congregations in Tennessee and Arkansas. He received his Master of Divinity from Memphis Theological Seminary and his Doctorate of Ministry degree from Lexington Theological Seminary. He and Cathie have been married more than 30 years and have two grown daughters and one granddaughter.

The Pulpit Search Committee has worked tirelessly since February 2008 to find the right Senior Minister for Lindenwood. The committee unanimously voted April 24, 2009, to rec-

## A message from our new Senior Minister

Memorial Day weekend, 2009, was one of the most rewarding (and busiest) weekends of our adult lives. Catherine and I were overwhelmed by your kindness, your hospitality, and the friendship and love you offered us. If it were not for other responsibilities and obligations, I think we would have just sent the moving vans to Kentucky and stayed here with you. But I do have obligations and responsibilities to which I must give some attention over the next few weeks. There is much for me to learn about your Sunday School programs, youth programs, senior adult programs, and worship services. I need to spend some time getting to know staff members, lay

leaders, and homebound members that I won't get to meet at church for a while. I would like to be at full speed on day one, but that probably won't happen. But I am not worried. I have already observed your love and support, and I know that you will grant me the time and give me the help I need to be the very best pastor I can be.

Please know that Lindenwood Christian Church and its members are in my daily prayers, just as First Christian Church in Hopkinsville and its members are in my prayers. Even though I have not begun my official duties, I have already begun the work I will do. I am studying your congregation, its history, its constitution and by-laws. I am making plans for sermons and for the installation service in September. You will have my undivided attention as soon as I close my ministry in Hopkinsville. Then we will have plenty of time to explore our next steps as we seek to serve the cause of Christ in Midtown Memphis.

Thank you again for calling me to be your minister.

# MESSAGE FROM OUR MINISTER

*For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven.  
Ecclesiastes 3:1*

Dear Lindenwood Family,

How it warmed my heart to see the joy in your eyes and on your faces as you welcomed the Rev. Dr. Ron Buck as the new Senior Minister of Lindenwood Christian Church! It was truly a delight to see you embrace both Ron and his wife, Cathie, with such warmth. God continues to grace this congregation in amazing ways and I believe that the future is bright with hope and possibility.



Reflecting on the excitement and energy of calling Dr. Buck, of course, I was also drawn to reflect on the events of the last year. It's been a journey full of highs and lows but always a journey full of God's Spirit. This is my ninth interim pastorate and with each one I am always struck anew with how congregations, like individuals, experience the "Circle of Life" – maybe you remember that song from "The Lion King." The chorus of that song goes "It's the Circle of Life and it moves us all through despair and hope, through faith and love, till we find our place on the path unwinding, in the Circle, the Circle of Life." a time to weep, and a time to laugh;

a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together;  
a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;  
a time to seek, and a time to lose;  
a time to keep, and a time to throw away;  
a time to tear, and a time to sew;  
a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;  
a time to love, and a time to hate;  
a time for war, and a time for peace.*

*Ecclesiastes 3:1-8*

I find these words of great hope. For when things look their darkest, we can rest assured that there will be times of light, even as we weep we can be assured that there will be laughter. God never promised us only good times; we know that there will come times of challenge and conflict. But, in every time, we have the blessed assurance that God is with us, Christ Jesus is redeeming us and the Holy Spirit is leading and guiding us. # Twelve has a lot going for it

As numbers go, twelve has a lot to recommend it.

There were 12 tribes of ancient Israel. There were 12 chosen disciples and then 12 apostles. Since ancient times, people have recognized 12 lunar cycles, and hence we have 12 months in a year.

Our clocks are divided by 12 hours and in music there are 12 notes or tones in succession before they are repeated at an octave.

And now comes the good news that in our stewardship campaign, "A New Coat of Faith", our pledges counted so far amount to a 12 percent increase over the previous year.

Twelve. Let's call it the perfect

number.

As Rev. Johnny Wray reported last week to the stewardship committee, "Thus far we've received 243 pledges totaling \$795,401 – that's a 12 percent increase (\$85,855) over last year!"

The pledges include 205 renewed pledges and 28 new pledges.

More pledges were expected this past weekend and through the end of the campaign. Last year a total of 348 pledges were made to the church.

To reach so far a 12 percent growth in a year of economic downturns and slumping figures in almost every industry is a mark of what faith can do, according to Rev. Wray.

Back to that number twelve:

# Volunteer for June 20 Day of Service

Don't miss the opportunity to be part of Lindenwood's first Day of Service from 8:30 a.m. -12:30 p.m., June 20. We will focus on three community organizations – Angel Food Ministries, Door of Hope, and MIFA.

The deadline for volunteer sign-up and child care registration is June 14 in Easterwood Gallery and online at [www.lindenwoodcc.com](http://www.lindenwoodcc.com). Childcare will be available from 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. for infants through age 12.

The Day of Service will begin at 8 a.m. in Stauffer Hall with muffins, coffee and juice and possibly Angel Food unloading if the food has been delivered at that time. At 8:40 a.m., all Day of Service volunteers will gather for prayer and a message from Rev. Johnny Wray. Angel Food and MIFA volunteers will stay at church to volunteer. Door of Hope volunteers can ride the church shuttle to the Door of Hope Pilgrim's Rest building, located on Court Avenue in the Medical Center area.

Here is a summary of the projects:

**Angel Food Ministries: *Volunteers needed: 20-30. Times: 8:30-11 a.m.*** Lindenwood is an Angel Food Ministries distribution site. Angel Food offers a week's worth of groceries for \$30 and is open to everyone. Participants order and pay for food ahead of time and pick up orders at distribution sites. Unloading and sorting begins around 8:30 a.m. Distribution is from 10-11 a.m. Volunteers are needed to unload, sort and distribute food and help people take groceries to their cars.

**Door of Hope: *Volunteers needed: 30-35. Times: 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m.*** Day of Service will "deep clean" Pilgrim's Rest from the inside out. Volunteers will clean blinds, windows, gutters, kitchen appliances and outdoor areas that need brush and weed removal. Door of Hope is a Midtown nonprofit agency for the homeless that Lindenwood has supported since the charity was founded. This spring Door of Hope took steps to acquire the Pilgrim's Rest building on Court. The facility currently provides housing for 9 formerly homeless people but can house up to 16. Lindenwood has committed to help "spruce up" the place with cleaning, painting and repair work. For more information visit [door-of-hope-memphis.org](http://door-of-hope-memphis.org).

**MIFA: *Volunteers needed: 6-10.*** Volunteers are needed to sort school uniform donations and deliver them to MIFA. The newly refurbished MIFA Thrift Store is in desperate need of school uniforms. Items needed are white collared shirts and dress pants in navy, khaki, and black in sizes appropriate for preschoolers up to high school seniors. Husky sizes are particularly needed. Some schools allow students to wear collared shirts in one additional color so red, yellow, navy and black collared shirts would also be useful. Donations may be dropped off at the Day of Service table in Easterwood Gallery through June 20.

## Board of Directors to Change

A new Senior Minister is not the only change of leadership coming to Lindenwood. Nominees to replace five board members who began their terms in July 2005 will soon be announced. Election will take place during the Church's Annual Congregational Meeting June 28th at 4 p.m.

Based on Church By-Laws, board members are elected to a 2-year term and the election of members is staggered. Members who faithfully fulfill their first term may be immediately eligible for nomination for one additional term, and generally are. Those board members completing 4-year terms and rolling off are: Beth Bartholomew, John Nutt, Murray Wells, Joe Williams, and Board Chair Cheryl Stevens Manning.

Ms. Stevens Manning recently discussed her experience on the Board. She stressed, above all, the *commitment* of fellow board members to serve despite otherwise busy lives, jobs and families. "I didn't know I'd be living at the church every weekend!" as a board member, she exclaimed. "But it's not about me or any one of us (board members)—it's about the church, the congregation, and our future here."

Ms. Stevens Manning said the Board grew especially close through the process of recommending a new Senior Minister. "It has always been God's plan and God's decision," she said of the process. "I'm very confident of that." Through the process, she believes the Church and the Board were blessed by the gifts of board members, the interim senior and associate ministers, and church staff. "Personally and together we've been through great spiritual turning points."

One remaining item the Chair hopes the Board can accomplish by June is to establish a Scholarship Committee at Lindenwood. This need was especially highlighted during this transition of ministers.

Qualifications for new board members are outlined in Church By-Laws. In addition, Ms. Stevens Manning described that the Nominating Committee looks for involvement in church ministries and a special commitment to God and the church. Above all, "generous commitment" is the key.

Ms. Stevens Manning was exceptionally complimentary and grateful for all eight fellow board directors. "We've shared our thoughts and opinions, and we've cried and prayed," she said. Four who began terms in July 2007 and will remain are: Arlene Diaz, Lynn Pleasants, Matt Salazar, and Kyle Williams. The Senior Minister is also an ex-officio member of the Board. Information on the Board of Directors, and the Church By-Laws and Constitution are available through Lindenwood's on-line member website. Copies of minutes from Board meetings are available in the Church Library.

Laudate!, the youth choir of Lindenwood Christian Church, is set to embark June 13 on their annual Spring Tour. We will sing for worship at Pulaski Heights Christian Church.

One very exciting new addition to the tour will be a sponsorship, built into the tour cost for each individual, of a “gift” at Heifer International, a nonprofit, humanitarian organization dedicated to ending hunger and poverty and caring for the Earth.

Our gift donation is described on Heifer International’s website as: Promise Basket - A Commitment to End Poverty. Give struggling families the promise of a secure future with this special basket, filled with the kinds of livestock our project partners need to add protein to their diets and income to their lives - much-needed income that’s used to pay for housing, clothing, schooling and medicine. The basket’s geese, ducks and chickens lay eggs that provide nutrition, and the basket’s rabbits multiply quickly, ensuring that other families will soon benefit from Heifer’s requirement that recipients “Pass on the Gift” of their livestock’s offspring.

Despite our local, national and global economy, we, as a choir, as a group of youth, as members of Lindenwood and the Disciples of Christ, and as Christians can certainly make a difference in our world, to feed our neighbor and care for our Earth. Laudate! is proud to be a part of such a unique group as Heifer International, and will be touring their state-of-the-art, LEED certified, “green” headquarters in addition to viewing the Village and Wetlands adjacent to the International headquarters.



## Outdoor learning part of Lindenwood Child Care

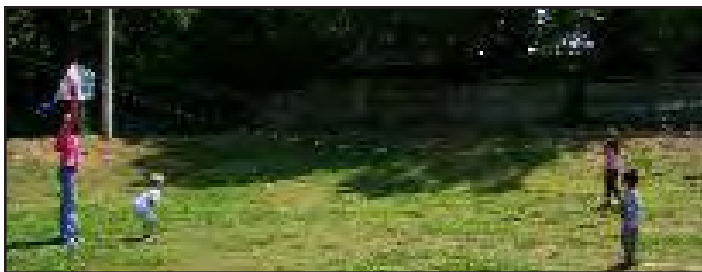

Greetings to Lindenwood church members from the Child Care Center! Throughout the spring, we have been privileged to watch many of our teachers step out of their comfort zone and introduce their class to new outdoor environments; we would love to share with you what our children are learning!

We are certainly grateful for our playground space and utilize it throughout the day, but as a school we are learning that daily, hands-on experiences with nature are critical for your child’s development. Although we are located in a very urban area, we are fortunate to have several green spaces around the church property where our children can look for bugs, roll in the grass, fly kites, garden, make mud pies, splash in puddles, and pick flowers.

*Teaching children about the natural world should be one of the most important events of their lives.* Thomas Berry



Interactions with nature teach preschoolers science concepts such as cause and effect, the life cycle, animal classifications, plant growth, weather, seasonal changes, and basic chemistry and physics (ie, observing ice melt or making the

biggest splash in the puddle). Our commitment to the outdoor learning process is why we will now require rain-boots for children entering our older classes; we want our children to be free to fully experience everything that nature has to offer.

A lifelong educator and author once said that “Every child should have mud pies, grasshoppers, water-bugs, tadpoles, frogs, wild strawberries, acorns, chestnuts, trees to climb, brooks to wade in, water-lilies, bees, butterflies, various animals to pet, hay-fields, pine-cones, rocks to roll, and sand, and any child who has been deprived of these has been deprived of the best part of his education.” At Lindenwood, we are committed to teaching the whole child and to providing developmentally appropriate, hands-on experiences; when our children go home covered in dirt, we can rest assured that they learned a lot at preschool! Thank you for sharing the church’s extensive grounds with our children.
